Sample Schedule (You don't have to follow this time table but we do ask you include each element.)

It is ok to let the conversation wonder a little but try to redirect back to the passage. Allow people freedom to answer however they wish. Even if it doesn't line up with Scripture. However, if it doesn't make sure to discuss that further by asking questions and directed statements to help the group see what Scripture truly says about the matter.

Allow people time to share answers. It might be quite for a few moments after you ask a question. Sit in the Silence. This is tough no matter how long you have been leading a group.

Sticky Statement: We are to honor God by how we love Him and others.

Hebrews 13:1-6

Read 13:1-6

What stands out to you in this passage?

For those that were able to make it Sunday or watched it online, was there anything said in the message that stood out to you?

What does it mean to honor someone?

What does it look like to honor God?

What does "brotherly" love look like?

What is it that allows Christians to have familial love for other believers around the world?
It is the fact that we are united by Christ.

Read verse two again. What do you think it is talking about?

It is saying that we are to receive everyone we encounter with love and kindness because we may be serving an angel as a test from God.

What does that mean for Christians?

It is a reminder that we are to love and serve everyone not matter their circumstance as though we are serving Christ.

How can we love the suffering and the prisoner?

Are there some prisoner that are harder to love than other? Why or why not?

In those instances do they still need Jesus? Why or why not?

How can you show love even when its difficult?

How do we honor God in marriage?

Read Ephesian 5:22-33. We honor God by living out these verses.

What does living out these verses look like?

For the wife it is supporting her husband as he spiritually leads the house.

For the husband, it is giving up comfort and time in order to ensure you wife has what she needs. It is sacrificing you wants and sometimes your needs to ensure your wife is cared for and protected. It is dying to self daily in order to model for your family what it is to live like Christ.

It starts with the husband stepping up and living as God has called, with compassionate strength.

Are you able to honor God in marriage if you are single? How?

It is reserving your heart and body for your future spouse. You honor God by looking to Him to guide you in all relationships.

What does it mean to “love” money?

You see it as the goal not a means to and end. It becomes what you worship rather than God.

How does a love of money affect your relationship with God?

When we love money it takes our focus off of Him. It becomes what we depend on for safety and security rather than God.

What is our author saying in verse 6?

When we find our security in Christ there is nothing that man can do to us that will last.

Yes they can cause pain but it is not eternal pain. When we rest in Jesus all pain is temporary and is used to bring growth in our walk with Christ.

What are somethings you can do this week to honor God?

We are to honor God by how we love Him and others.
